Cancer information

Cancer education programs

Our free education programs for people with cancer and their family and friends, help you learn more about cancer and give you the opportunity to meet others in a similar situation. They cover a range of topics including cancer and its treatments, living with cancer, survival skills and how to cope.

Legal, financial and workplace advice

We provide people affected by cancer with access to free legal, financial, workplace and small business advice if they cannot afford to pay for it.

We can also help to find community and government resources that may be able to help financially.

Wig service

Losing your hair as a result of cancer treatment is challenging for many people. Our Wig Service stocks a range of new and nearly new wigs, and turbans for sale at affordable prices.

Cancer support groups

Support groups provide a safe place for people affected by cancer to talk to others in a similar situation in a confidential and supportive environment. Cancer Council offers a range of support groups, these may be face to face, online or over the phone.

Peer support

If you'd like to speak with someone who's had a similar experience, our Cancer Connect program can match you with a trained volunteer who has been through the same or similar diagnosis and treatment.

There is also a professionally moderated online support community where people affected by cancer can find, receive and provide support by participating in groups, discussions, blogs and webinars.

Treatment centres

There are both public and private cancer treatment facilities in the ACT. Most centres also offer a variety of allied health services to their patients such as social work, nutrition services, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, pastoral care, palliative care, etc. Speak with your specialist to find a centre that is most appropriate for your situation and treatment.

At the time of printing, the Canberra Region Cancer Centre at Canberra Hospital is the only facility in the ACT that provides a radiation therapy service. If you require radiation therapy, your doctor will refer you to this service.

Palliative care

Palliative care aims to help people with a life-limiting illness to live as fully and comfortably as possible. It involves a range of services offered by doctors, nurses and allied health professionals, as well as volunteers and carers, who work together to meet a person's physical, practical, emotional and spiritual needs, as well as providing support to family and friends.

Palliative care is offered in different settings, depending on the situation. It can be provided at home, in a residential aged-care facility, in a hospital or in a palliative care unit.

Genetics and risk

While most cases of cancer are not due to a history of cancer in the family, for a small number of people, their family history suggests they may have a genetic risk. This means their chance of developing cancer is potentially higher than the average population.

The family doctor is the best place to discuss concerns and determine if a referral for genetic counselling is required. Genetic counselling services provide information, services and support for patients and their families with or at risk of developing an inherited health condition.

Cancer Council's Pro Bono Program provides people affected by cancer with access to free legal, financial, workplace and small business advice if they cannot afford to pay for it.

The program connects people with professionals in the community who volunteer their time. These include lawyers, financial advisors, small business accountants and human resources/recruitment specialists. They can assist with a range of issues such as drafting wills and powers of attorney, accessing superannuation, insurance claims, debt management and workplace issues.
